Definition of the scope of surveying and examination for the Environmental Impact Study (EIS) for the Nord Stream pipeline through the Baltic

Your letter 663/Nord Stream dated January 17,2007

Dear Sirs,

The documents which you submit initially concern only the sector from the boundary of the German Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) up to the landing point in Lubmin.

The *Munitionsbergungsdienst* (MDD M-V, Munitions Disposal Service of the German Federal State of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern) is not in possession of any indications of possible munitions for the route stated in your enquiry. There is, in the view of the *Munitionsbergungsdienst* no cause at present for surveying or other action.

Herr Zschesche (Tel.: 038379/20316) or a deputy is at your service, however, should you have any queries.

Previous experience does, however, indicate that the possibility of isolated munitions finds may nonetheless occur even in areas classified by the *Munitionsbergungsdienst* as munitions-free. For this reason, any and all excavation or similar activities must be conducted with the corresponding preparation and care. Work and all other activities at the find location and in the immediate vicinity must be stopped immediately and the *Munitionsbergungsdienst* informed immediately should munitions or any objects which might be suspected of being munitions be found during this work.
